HISTORICAL TIMELINE:



**1000
BCE**

The Kingdom of David is established in the ancient kingdoms of Israel & Judah.

**586
BCE**

The first Jewish Temple was destroyed by the Babylonians. They conquer the province of Judah and expel the Jews from the area. This is the first Jewish diaspora. The Persians later conquer the Kingdom of Judah and name it Yehud. The Jews are able to return back to Ancient Israel from exile.

70 CE

The Jews rebuild the great temple, known as The Second Temple. Christianity emerges and begins to spread. Romans destroy the Second Temple in Jerusalem. The Jewish-Roman war begins.

136 CE

The Romans gain control of Ancient Israel and rename Judea to Palaestina (the Philistines were the enemy of the Jews at the time so the name was created to insult the Jews) in an attempt to erase the ties of the Jewish people to the land. The Romans expel the Jews.

610

The Islamic Religion emerges. Muslim ideology spreads and conquests to the Middle East begin. The Al-Aqsa Mosque is built on the ruins of the Jewish temple.

1517

The Ottoman Empire, now Turkish empire, gains control of Palaestina (Ancient Israel).

1897

The term "Zionism" is coined from the word "Zion" as diaspora Jews and Jews living in the land of Palaestina develop a strong sense of nationalism and desire to return to their homeland. The Zionist Movement begins.

1917

The British gain control of Palaestina and The British Mandate of Palestine is established. The Balfour Declaration made by the British government expresses the need for a Jewish homeland in Palestine.

**1933-
1945**

World War II and the Holocaust occur, 6 million Jews are murdered in a systematic killing by the Nazis to ethnically cleanse the Jews. The word "genocide" is created by Raphael Lemkin in 1944.

1947

The **UN Partition Plan** proposal to divide the land of Israel fairly based on desert land and agricultural land is accepted by Israel, but **rejected by Arab nations**.

**1948-
1949**

The word genocide is adopted by the UN. Israel is declared an independent state in 1948. **Surrounding Arab states declare war on new state of Israel** to oppose its establishment. marking the beginning of the 1947-1949 war. Israel emerged as the victor.





1967

Israel receives intel about an impending attack. Israel launches a preemptive strike, this becomes the Six-Day War. Israel emerges as the victor and conquers three territories of Gaza (Egypt), The West Bank (Jordan), The Sinai Peninsula (Egypt), the Golan Heights (Syria), and Jerusalem (Jordan). Israel, Egypt, Jordan and Syria sign a ceasefire.



1973

Egypt and Syria launched a surprise attack on Israel on Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the year for Jews. Israel defended itself and emerged victorious. This is known as the Yom Kippur War.



1979

The Camp David Accords lead to a peace treaty. **Israel returned the Sinai Peninsula to Egypt in exchange FOR PEACE.**

1987

A violent uprising of the Palestinian people living in Gaza and the West bank begins, known as The First Intifada.



1993

The Oslo Accords are signed. Israel and the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) recognize each other. **Israel agrees to limited Palestinian self-rule in parts of the West Bank and Gaza Strip in exchange FOR PEACE.**



2000

Israel makes offers and proposes to change core ideas FOR PEACE during The Camp David Accords, **but these offers are rejected by Palestinian leadership.** The Second Intifada occurs consisting of terrorist attacks and suicide bombings inside Israel.

2004

Mahmoud Abbas takes over as the Palestinian leader.



2005

Israel completely withdraws from Gaza FOR PEACE. Instead of transforming it into a prosperous and peaceful region, it unfortunately became a hub for extremist terrorists.

2006

Hamas wins the Palestinian legislative election, gaining majority control.



2008

Israel offers concessions FOR PEACE, which are rejected by Hamas, leading to conflict.



2023

On October 7, 2023, Hamas terrorists launch brutal attack on civilians in Israel. This massacre resulted in the death of over 1400 Israeli civilians in 1 day. Men, women, children and elderly were brutally murdered, raped and kidnapped from their homes and from a music festival. This attack occurred on the holy Jewish holiday of Simchas Torah. War breaks out as 240 hostages are held and tortured in Gaza.

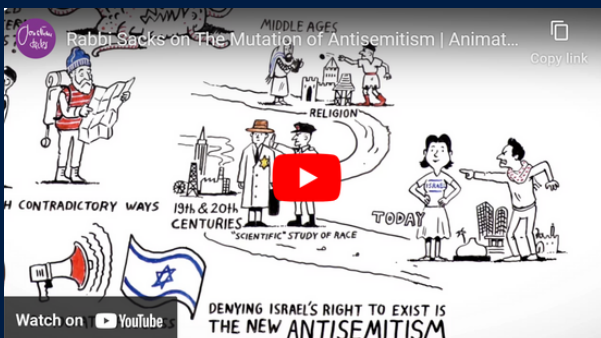

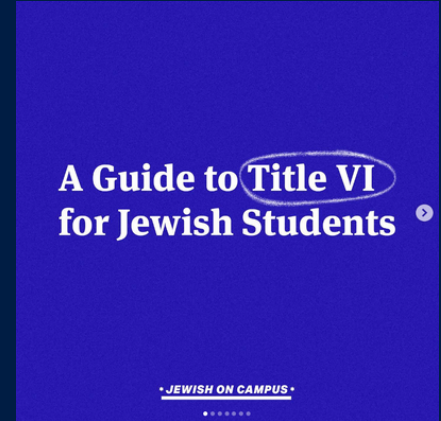

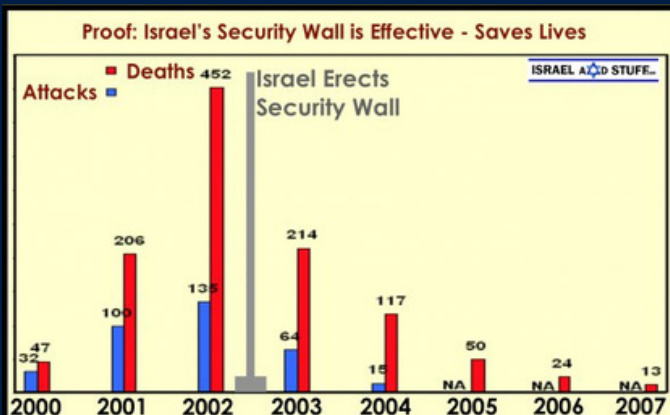

THE TRUTH ABOUT HAMAS AND THEIR CIVILIANS

QUICK FACTS:



1 22 Arab states in the world. 1 Jewish state in the world.

2 Jewish presence in Israel for >3000 years, the term “Jew” stems from the land Judea, which is present day West Bank.
(Evidence: Dead Sea Scrolls, Babylonian Cuneiform Tablets)

3 Israel has made multiple peace offers to Palestinians (e.g., Camp David and Oslo Accords, Abraham Accords), which have all been rejected by the Palestinian Authority.

4 1967: Israel acquired Gaza Strip
2005: Israel withdrew all presence, evacuating Israelis
Goal: Peace & recognition of the right to exist by Palestinians by Israel, but Hamas took control, leading instead to terrorism.

5 Israel provides humanitarian aid to Gaza despite the conflict, including gas, water, electricity, food, and employment, without requiring payment.

6 Currently, 1.9 million Arabs live in Israel with full equal rights. Arab-Israeli citizens can serve in the Supreme Court, vote in elections, and have careers as doctors, lawyers, pharmacists, etc. This stands in contrast to the definition of an apartheid system, where there's state-sanctioned and institutionalized racial or ethnic segregation and discrimination.

7 Israel takes significant measures to prevent civilian casualties. The IDF warns Palestinian civilians in advance of targeting specific areas. Hamas often forces their civilians to stay in danger zones as “human shields,” to increase casualties for PR purposes.

8 Hamas uses international aid given to Palestinians to build tunnels and ammunition in support of terrorism, instead of infrastructure and aid for their people.

9 The Arab population grew in Israel from 150,000 in 1948 to 1.96 million in 2020. Arab citizens constitute 21.1% of the total Israeli population. This serves as evidence of Israel's commitment to diversity and dispels any notion of ethnic cleansing.

Quotes from The Hamas charter:

10 “Israel will exist, and will continue to exist, until Islam abolishes it, as it abolished that which was before it” (Preamble)

“The Day of Judgment will not come about until Muslims fight Jews and kill them. Then, the Jews will hide behind rocks and trees, and the rocks and trees will cry out: 'O Muslim, there is a Jew hiding behind me, come and kill him.'” (Article 7)

“Israel with its Jewish identity and Jewish people is challenging Islam and the Muslims. May the cowardly know no sleep.” (Article 32)

EMAIL TEMPLATE FOR STUDENTS TO SEND TO PROFESSORS

Subject: Request for Understanding and Sensitivity Regarding [Anti-Semitism / Current Israeli-Hamas Conflict]

Dear Professor [Professor's Last Name],

I hope this email finds you well. I am writing to you as a student in your [Course Name] class, and I would like to bring up a matter that is of significant importance to me given the recent events involving the terrorist group Hamas and the escalating conflict. I believe that open and respectful communication is essential for our academic environment, and I would like to discuss an issue that concerns me in the context of the current situation.

I have observed some instances in [where the incident took place: classroom, email communication, etc] that have left me feeling uncomfortable and concerned as a Jewish student, particularly in light of the current events. When you [describe the specific incident or behavior], it made me feel [describe your feelings or reactions].

I am reaching out to request your understanding and sensitivity regarding this matter, especially in the context of the ongoing conflict. It is my hope that, as an educator committed to diversity and inclusivity, you would be willing to consider being more mindful of exactly what message you're portraying to your students. It's crucial to note that Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin in programs or activities that receive federal financial assistance. Executive Order 13899 reaffirmed the basic principle that antisemitism and discrimination of Jews is included in this. This includes our educational institution. **[ONLY APPLICABLE TO U.S STUDENTS]**

It's important to be sensitive to the fact that the recent events have greatly impacted Israeli civilians, with acts of terror, kidnapping, and murder. Furthermore, there has been a concerning global rise in antisemitic incidents that have affected Jewish communities worldwide, including within our academic community, which you inadvertently are contributing to.

As a student, I never imagined feeling unsafe on campus and ignored in the classroom. Recent incidents and the global spike in antisemitism have made it increasingly difficult to engage fully in our academic pursuits. I'm compelled to write this message because I genuinely believe that open dialogue and awareness can help create a more aware and respectful learning environment for all students.

I am happy to engage in further discourse if you need more clarification on where I'm coming from, and I appreciate your time.


